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1. Preface

This book will be written as an ultimate attempt to publish my experimental research in life science. I tried to study and approach the life organism in nature unprejudiced. But living in a society demanding absolute obeying laws and doctrines, originating from conservatism and religions, it is an almost unfeasible attempt. Nevertheless I succeeded more or less to survive external influences, keeping alive and at the same time doing independent research as adventure and life style. Adventurous pioneering does not fit in an organized society. If you find an interesting phenomenon, no one saw before, then it is treated more or less as radicalism, fiction or assumption and possibly heresy. Accused, by some conservative scientists, of faking data and registrations.

I make a distinction between real observation, interpreted by the classical mechanics and physics, and my interpretation to form a "work model". Such a work model is not a final result it is merely a temporary base or platform to work on.

I experienced in medical research that publishing really new found phenomenons is impossible because you cannot refer to other publications or it is not written in the standard text books. It will not pass the scientific boards for publication. Even a new development has been clinically proven on patients with amazing positive results it will never be accepted as long as it is not an extrapolation of the settled doctrines.

Even like pioneers in an unknown area you make big and rough steps to look for interesting things. Details comes later. But when you meet such a lot of new exiting things you barely have time left to bother about details and proper documentation. I admit that documenting your results is quite important and must be very accurately. It is inevitable to adjust your theories so you are continuously wondering what's the right moment to write it down. Even in this book arises the question if it is the right moment for publishing. As a matter of fact it is never the right moment so a compromise is inevitable.

My extraordinary approach and way of life is not contributing a reliable impression to the more assimilated and organized scientists but I see it as a duty to publish and propagate my work and results.

The phenomenons and my theories are in a critical stage now forcing me to publish even I discovered an extreme interesting feedback control system initiating the evolution process. The existence of just this system might explain the origin of religions by primitive man. You cannot blame primitive man long ago. But now several thousands of years later it is not acceptable that those religions are being used to deform our community and freedom . It is not only used to survive but implicitly satisfying the urge for power and authority. The spirit of power. Still now we are locked up in an own created prison.

The real life system might turn out to be a anti-climax for religions but it opens a new exiting field for life science and the quality of life.

Another consideration of writing this book is to avoid producing a scientific publication conform the academic rules. Either I write an unreadable scientific document or I write a novel everybody can read. The first option might get attention of a small group scientist making before the end of the first page their own conclusion without further study. The second option restricts only to some basic and popular stuff without coming to the point.

I decide a combination. Maybe it will do and hold the interest of the reader. For I'm not an experienced story teller it will be a difficult discipline. The only excuse I can say '*the results justifies the means*'.

I hope you will enjoy or detest this book intensively and hope it will contribute to get rid of patronizing and power-hungry religions and cerebral blocked academic blokes.
